Our curriculum is designed to support the whole child and to encourage creativity and foster curiosity. - Small group instruction with hands-on learning activities
- Positive routines and expectations
- Opportunities to build independence skills
- Emphasis on teamwork, collaboration and social development
- Instruction integrated with the arts
- Appropriate challenges coupled with continuous encouragement

WHAT DOES THE CHC PREKINDERGARTEN 3 CURRICULUM LOOK LIKE?

The curriculum encourages a balance between academic and social skills. In math, students develop early number sense. To build early literacy skills, students receive explicit instruction on the alphabet, learning to identify letters and recalling letter sounds. Social studies provides students with the opportunity to learn about themselves, their community and their world. In science, students pose questions, look for answers and explore the natural world around them. Carefully designed activities in Spanish, art, physical education, music and library classes support academic and social skills.

WHAT KEY SKILLS/CONCEPTS DO CHC PREKINDERGARTEN 3 CLASSROOMS INTRODUCE TO STUDENTS?

Math:

- Identify and order numbers
- Count from 1 to 10
- Identify and create patterns
- Compare, position and order objects
- Identify, create and compare shapes

Language Arts:

- Name recognition
- Letter and sound recognition
- Writing first name
- Recognize the difference between numbers and letters as well as write and draw

Oral Communication/Comprehension:

- Follow two-step directions
- Develop oral vocabulary
- Express ideas
- Ask and answer questions
- Retell the events of a story

Social Skills:

- Work with peers to create art or complete a task
- Learn to advocate for needs
- Develop friendships and connections with peers and adults
